January 15 will mark my one year anniversary as the senior pastor of Nichols Hills United Methodist Church, and I want to thank each of you for the warm way you have embraced Allyson, Charlotte, Avery, and me. We love being part of the Nichols Hills UMC family. We have received many blessings in the last twelve

months, and we are looking forward to serving in ministry with the fine people of Nichols Hills UMC for many years to come.

2015 was a very fruitful year in the life of our church. Our average weekly worship attendance grew 14% from 152 to 173. Thirteen people joined the church. Five people were baptized. Many people in our church have grown in generosity including 24 people who made a financial commitment to the church for the first time, 37 people increased their financial commitment to the church, and our overall pledges have risen from \$571,695 in 2014 to \$597,320 in 2015. I am so happy to see the way that the Holy Spirit is at work in our church helping so many people grow as disciples of Jesus Christ. Thank you for the wonderful way so many of you give generously and serve in ministry through our church.

I am confident that God will bless us in many ways in 2016, and I am excited about the opportunities we will have to grow as a disciples of Jesus and to grow as a church. Lent and Easter come early this year, and our **Ash Wednesday Service** will be on February 10 at 6:00 p.m. We are also planning to start **Nichols Thrills** on Wednesday, February 17, and we are planning on offering **Dave Ramsey's Financial Peace University** which is a nine-week class on money. Dave and his teaching team will walk you through the basics of budgeting, dumping debt, planning for the future, and much more! We are also going to offer a 4-week study called **Catch** which focuses on invitational evangelism. This study includes daily scripture readings for you to do at home and will help you learn how you can be part of helping our church to attract people in our community and help them grow in faith. I hope you will consider being part of one of these exciting small group opportunities during Lent.

This Sunday we will continue our **Moving Past Your Past** sermon series by focusing on **Forgiving Those Who Hurt You.** The work of forgiveness is never easy, but learning how to let God help you work through a process of forgiveness is one of the greatest gifts any of us can receive. We are also going to offer anointing with oil as a way of helping you heal from any of the hurts you have received. I hope you will join us for worship at 8:30 or 10:50 this Sunday. Have a great week.

Each winter we are challenged to keep our children active and moving because of the weather. Our Amazing Athletes' Coaches come twice a week for activities and instruction in different types of sports. It is a year-round program specially designed to enhance children's learning through movement. The children learn the basic fundamentals and mechanics of nine different sports while also building self-confidence, teamwork, and improving seven key areas of motor development. Each child receives instruction based on their own developmental level. It is non-competitive and provides a learning-based environment. There are the typical sports we are all familiar with. They learn about basketball, baseball, soccer, football, volleyball, hockey, golf, tennis, and lacrosse. The coaches have the children warm up, cool down, and have group discussions about the importance of athletics. Two year olds and up participate in Amazing Athletes. We are so proud to have them in The Learning Center.
