Jesus' Prayer of Forgiveness

On Sunday I will be humbled to preach on one of the most extraordinary prayers ever prayed in the history of the world. It's not a long prayer. It's no threat to the Guinness World Record length prayer, as we talked about a couple of weeks ago. It's only ten words long, and eight of the ten words are single syllable words. This particular prayer has rocked the minds and hearts of pretty much every one who has ever heard it throughout history.

We find this prayer in Luke 23:34. "Father, forgive them for they know not what they do." You all know the context. This was Jesus' prayer as spikes were being sledge-hammered into his hands and feet by blood-thirsty, profane executioners whose next act was to play poker to see who would win the robe that they had just stripped off Jesus' back just before they had beaten and broken his body. These executioners were not model citizens with low paying jobs. These men were so filled with violence and rage that the only role that the Roman army could find for them was for them to be cold-hearted crucifiers; professional, legal, murderers; and they loved their jobs. It was to these men, as they were doing their jobs with sledgehammers and spikes on Jesus' hands and feet that Jesus looked towards heaven on their behalf and prayed that never-to-be-forgotten ten-word-prayer, "Father, forgive them for they know not what they do."

You can tell a lot about a person's heart by what they pray for when they've been wronged. It's a unique window into the condition of someone's heart and soul. Every single one of us has been wronged by another person. We live in a world filled with wrong-doers. You can't live in this world for very long without being wronged. We've all been wronged.

I have listened to many people describe to me the various ways that they have been wronged. On Sunday I want to share three categories of wrong-doing that have helped me differentiate just how wronged someone has been relative to how wronged others have been because this helps me know how to respond in the moment, how to give counsel, and how to urge someone to say prayers when they have been wronged. I hope this will be helpful to you.

Someone will come to me, and they've been wronged. They think, "Well, pastors should care about this kind of stuff," so they run up to me. They start describing to me how they've been wronged: who did it, where it happened, time of day, how it felt. While they're describing this wrong-doing to me I start praying to God. "God, give me discernment about how to think about this and how to be wise in my response." As they tell me about the wrong-doing I look at the expression on the person's face. I read the body language. I search for non-verbal cues because I want to put this wrong-doing in the right category in my mind so that I can give good counsel.

I hope you will join us on Sunday at 8:30 or 10:50 as we discuss three categories of wrong doing and how Jesus' prayer of forgiveness can help us open our hearts to receive the forgiveness of Jesus so that we can forgive others. Have a great week, and I will see you at church.

We are excited to announce a new app from RDS called Unite that allows you to have access to our church directory, make contributions, change your personal information, and view your personal contribution history all from your phone!


