Concerning money, Mark Vincent writes, "Money has a god-like power. I think about it a lot. How and when I might get more of it. What I will do with it once I get it. How much of it I want to share. How much of it I want to keep for myself. What I would do with it if I suddenly came into a large amount. Money consumes my waking moments and shows up in my dreams. In North America, where being a consumer is considered a birthright, money's hold is so powerful that one-third of all adults say financial worries prevent them from sleeping or relaxing."

Some churches don't talk about money. Their thought is that money can be a touchy subject, and the church would not want to make anyone feel uncomfortable. Yet, hardly a day goes by that most of us are able to avoid thinking some about money. We are bombarded with commercials and advertisements that beckon us to spend our money on just about anything.

Jesus had a lot to say about our money and our stuff. He believed that treasure management is a spiritual issue. In the next four Sundays, we are going to focus on Christian stewardship. As Herb Miller puts it, "Christian stewardship is the faithful management of all that God gives." In our *Being Rich in What Matters Most* sermon series we are going to look at what the Bible teaches us about financial management. How would Jesus want us to spend our money? How do I decide what percentage of my income Jesus is calling me to give in the next year? How does being a faithful Christian steward relate to being a disciple of Jesus Christ?

I want you to know that we are going to have fun as we discuss these important parts of our faith, and I want to invite you to open your heart to what God has to say to you. This sermon series will culminate in our **Consecration Sunday** on **November 13.** Dr. Ray Crawford, the senior pastor of First United Methodist Church in Claremore, will bring the message in worship that day, and we will have a free, catered Harvest Dinner immediately following the worship service. I hope you will make plans to be present in worship over the next month. I am truly excited about all that God is doing in our lives and in our church. May God continue to bless us as we continue to work together *to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world*.



## The Power of Story

Stories are powerful. In fact, they are so powerful that we tend to create a narrative around different events in our lives to try and make sense of what is happening. For instance, when something bad happens in our lives, we try and create a reason why it happened, or we try to create a narrative about how it plays into our lives and into our futures. Our whole society is built on stories. Our whole faith is built on stories. The entire Bible is built on stories about God and stories about people. The Bible is full of stories that help us to make sense of who God is

and who we are in the context of God.

My whole life as a Christian is built around the stories of Jesus as found in the Gospels. These stories guide and shape my life in a way that nothing else can. This week in our young adult group, we will be discussing how our stories can inspire others and point them to God. What is your story of faith? I encourage you this week to recall your story with God and perhaps to share it with someone close to you.

## **Consecration Sunday Is Coming**

At Nichols Hills United Methodist Church we approach financial stewardship from a biblical perspective. We do not view the money people give to our church merely as a way to pay the bills. Rather, we believe that how we handle money is a spiritual issue and that it is important to talk about how the wisdom we find in the Bible teaches us to use our money and our stuff in a way that is pleasing to God. We find that one of the best ways to help people grow spiritually in their relationship with God is by helping them to grow in generosity by supporting our church's mission and ministry with a percentage of their incomes. During the next four Sundays, our pastors, Trevor Smith and Matt Patrick will preach a sermon series called *Being Rich in What Matter Most* to teach the biblical and spiritual principles of generous giving in our stewardship emphasis this year.

Throughout these four Sundays we will focus on our relationship with God and how God's generosity to us calls us to respond by living a life of generosity. We'll let the Bible speak to us about the role of money and work in our lives and offer you some helpful steps that will help you work towards becoming debt free. We will turn to the teachings of Jesus to help you more clearly understand what it means to earn all you can, save all you can, and give all you can. You will have the opportunity to prayerfully ask God, "What percentage of my income is God calling me to give?"

Consecration Sunday will be on November 13. During our morning worship services at 8:30 and 10:50 a.m. on Consecration Sunday, we are asking the people in our church to make their financial commitments to our church's missionary, benevolent, and educational ministries in this community and around the world. Every person who completes an *Estimate of Giving Card* will do so voluntarily by attending morning worship on Consecration Sunday. However we encourage people to attend who feel strongly opposed to completing a card. The procedure will be done as an act of worship in such a way that no one will feel personal embarrassment if he or she chooses not to fill out a card.

We will do no home solicitation to ask people to complete cards. During morning worship our guest preacher, Dr. Ray Crawford, will conduct a brief period of instruction and inspiration in which we will each make our commitments as a confidential act of worship. We will be sharing more information about Consecration Sunday with you in our worship services in the coming weeks. Since we will make no follow-up visits to ask people to complete their cards, we will make every effort to inform and inspire in our hope that everyone will commit to attend Consecration Sunday for worship and our Harvest Dinner at 11:00 a.m. and noon on November 13. Thanks in advance for your enthusiastic participation in Consecration Sunday.

## Daily Devotional Featuring Denise Buthion

Recently our very own Denise Buthion, Director of The Learning Center, was featured in St. Luke's United Methodist Church's Daily Devotional, published by Gabrielle Moon, Executive Director at St. Luke's Children's Center. We are very excited for Denise and wanted to share this devotional with you.

He who walks with wise men becomes wise, but the companion of fools will suffer harm. –Proverbs 13:20

Denise Buthion is the person who taught me the most efficient way of running a childcare center. She came into my life because she was a parent of a child in the very first center I ever worked. I was a teacher and a mother of two children. She had a son who was three years old. She was a very knowledgeable person, and she and I got a long well, we developed a special friendship.

I was placed at a different facility within the same corporation after her son left my room, and we didn't really keep in touch. I worked hard at the other center, and was soon promoted back to the first center, where I became the Assistant Director. Denise had just been hired as the director, and together she and I would run this facility.

Denise guided people; she could talk to them and explain things to them about their jobs, and how to meet expectations in a way I had never been exposed to before, she was so very kind, and respected people's feelings. Even when there was disciplinary action taken, she did it in a way that the staff understood and looked up to her as a mentor, as I did for direction and guidance. She was well organized, and every task that we did in the center had a purpose and a specific outcome. She allowed me to have autonomy, but was watching from a distance to guide and teach me how to accomplish even the simplest task. Denise and I worked as a team for a little over a year, before I was promoted to a director. She gave me the wisdom to move up and be able to run my own center.

I made lots of mistakes that first year on my own. I thought I knew it all! Even when I was stressed out and thought I was going to snap, she was there for me every step of the way. She would talk me through how to word problems to parents, and how to speak so teachers would listen and respect me the way they did her. There were and still are lots of life lessons to learn.

I know, even today when I am scratching my head, looking for answers, I can always call Denise. She will always share her precious time with me, and make sure that I am on the right track. We have been through good times and bad times, and I was able to help her as well when she needed it a couple of years ago. It felt so good to be able to give back to her what she had shared with me for over thirty years.


