Rich Like Jesus

⁹ For you know the generous act of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though he was rich, yet for your sakes he became poor, so that by his poverty you might become rich. -II Corinthians 8:9

Did you know that the word believe appears in the Bible 273 times, pray appears 371 times, and love appears 714 times. Give appears 2,172 times. It appears that God is very interested in calling us to be giving people. There is something about giving and

being generous that is central to what it means to be a Christian.

In fact, the more we grow in our relationship with God the more we find that God is generous with us throughout our lives. God has given us life and the gift of creation. As John 3:16 tells us, "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life."

Jesus was generous in everything he did. His healing is for you. His teachings are for you. His ministry is for you. His love, grace, and mercy are for you.

As the Apostle Paul so clearly points out to us, Jesus was rich. The Son of God could have stayed in heaven, but he chose to come to us. He was born into poverty to very poor but very faithful parents. He lived a humble life, and he died a painful death so that you and I could be rich in his grace and inherit eternal life in his name. He gave his life for you and me so that we could receive the blessings and the salvation that he offers to us.

On Sunday we are going to talk about what it means for us to be rich like Jesus by looking at the primary teaching on generosity in the New Testament which we find in II Corinthians 8:1-15. The Apostle Paul lifts up the generosity of early Christians in the Macedonian churches. In II Corinthians 8:3-5, he described the generosity of these impoverished Christians this way:

³ For, as I can testify, they voluntarily gave according to their means, and even beyond their means, 4 begging us earnestly for the privilege of sharing in this ministry to the saints— 5 and this, not merely as we expected; they gave themselves first to the Lord and, by the will of God, to us....

What would it mean for you and me to give ourselves first to the Lord? It may just mean that we would find our true purpose in life by giving our lives away for the sake of others. I hope you will join us for worship at 8:30 or 10:50 on Sunday morning as we continue our Being Rich in What Matters Most sermon series by talking about how we can be Rich Like Jesus.

I also hope you will make plans to join us for worship at our Consecration Sunday at 8:30 and 10:50 and our free, catered, Harvest Dinner at 11:00 a.m. and 12:00 p.m. on Sunday, November 13. It will be a wonderful opportunity for us to celebrate our church's ministries and give thanks for all of the ways that God is blessing us. Have a great week, and I will see you on Sunday.
