

The Light Shines in the Darkness

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. ² He was in the beginning with God. ³ All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being. What has come into being ⁴ in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. ⁵ The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it. ¹⁴ And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth. –*John 1:1-5, 14*

Christmas Eve is almost here, and I hope you are planning to join us for one of our Candlelight Christmas Eve Services at 4:00 or 5:30 p.m. on Saturday. One of the things I look forward to every Christmas is *A Charlie Brown Christmas*. I particularly love the scene where an exasperated Charlie Brown blurts out, "I guess I really don't know what Christmas is all about. Isn't there anyone who knows what Christmas is all about?" Linus replies, "Sure Charlie Brown. I can tell you what Christmas is all about." Then he tells Charlie Brown the Christmas Story in *Luke's Gospel*.



I usually preach from *Luke's Gospel* on Christmas Eve, and it tells the traditional story about shepherds and angels and the baby Jesus in the manger. However, on Christmas Eve, as we ponder the real meaning of Christmas, we are going to turn to the Christmas story in *John's Gospel* and focus on the meaning as he understood it. We will also sing some of your favorite Christmas carols and conclude our services by passing the light and singing *Silent Night*. As part of our *Advent Conspiracy* this year, we are going to give away our entire Christmas Eve Offering to benefit young people at John Marshall High School and children around the world through Compassion International. I want to thank each of you who have given generously to children in our community and around the world so that they would experience the hope, peace, joy, and love of Christmas.

On Sunday, December 25 we will only have one worship service at 10:50 a.m. Dress will be casual, and you can wear your favorite Christmas sweater. We will not have Sunday school. On Sunday, January 1, we will return to our normal Sunday schedule with Worship services at 8:30 and 10:50 a.m. and Sunday School at 9:45 a.m.

I want to thank you for the generous way so many of you have committed to support our church's ministry in the coming year. As of today, the people in our church have committed \$668,714 to empower our church's ministry in 2017. This is \$34,094 more than was committed in the previous year and represents a 5.3% increase.
