# The Final Week

<sup>31</sup> Then he took the twelve aside and said to them, "See, we are going up to Jerusalem, and everything that is written about the Son of Man by the prophets will be accomplished. <sup>32</sup> For he will be handed over to the Gentiles; and he will be mocked and insulted and spat upon. <sup>33</sup> After they have flogged him, they will kill him, and on the third day he will rise again." <sup>34</sup> But they understood nothing about all these things; in fact, what he said was hidden from them, and they did not grasp what was said. –*Luke 18:31-34* 

Jesus spent most of his life in the northern part of the Holy Land in Galilee. He did most of his ministry there, but in Luke 9:51 Luke tells us, <sup>51</sup> When the days drew near for him to be taken up, he set his face to go to Jerusalem. This is a turning point in Luke's Gospel. The next ten chapters of Luke's Gospel are about Jesus' journey towards Jerusalem. This is important because Jesus knew that when he arrived in Jerusalem he would be crucified. Jesus could have avoided crucifixion by staying in Galilee. Jesus sets his face resolutely towards Jerusalem. He's on a journey, and he's a man who has three months to live. If you had three months to live what would you do with that time? What conversations would you have? Where would you go? What would you do?

On Sunday, our Scouts will lead us in worship, and we're going to talk about what Jesus chooses to do with the last three months of his life. Luke lays this out for us in Luke 9:51 to Luke 19:27. Our message on Sunday will set up the rest of our sermon series on *The Final Week* of Jesus' life.

I hope you will also make plans to join us for our Ash Wednesday service on February 10 at 6:00 p.m. as we begin the Lenten season. In this meaningful service, we will receive the imposition of ashes in the form of a cross on our foreheads to remind us that Jesus has overcome death to offer us resurrection and eternal life.

Then, on the Sundays in Lent I want to invite you to join Jesus on a journey that will lead to a cross. We are going to walk with Jesus through the last week of his life. On February 14 we are going to celebrate Palm Sunday here at Nichols Hills United Methodist Church. That usually happens at the very end of Lent. We're going to celebrate it at the beginning of Lent because that's how the last week of Jesus' life begins. Our children will wave Palm Branches and sing a special song. We'll remember the journey into Jerusalem. Then, every Sunday after that we'll be talking about Holy Monday, then Holy Tuesday, then Holy Wednesday, followed by Maundy Thursday and Good Friday when he was crucified. We'll be walking in his footsteps and trying to understand the answer to several questions. What kind of king is this? What kind of kingdom is he ushering in? What does he expect of his followers? Each week we are going to wrestle with these questions.

Nichols Thrills will begin again on Wednesday, February 17 with a Meal at 5:30 and two meaningful groups for adults. Mat Patrick will be leading a four week study on evangelism called *Catch*, and Jean Warner and I will be leading *Dave Ramsey's Financial Peace University*. I hope you will consider joining us for one of these meaningful small group experiences. Have a great week, and I will see you at church.
