## Maundy Thursday

<sup>17</sup> On the first day of Unleavened Bread the disciples came to Jesus, saying, "Where do you want us to make the preparations for you to eat the Passover?" <sup>18</sup> He said, "Go into the city to a certain man, and say to him, "The Teacher says, My time is near; I will keep the Passover at your house with my disciples." <sup>19</sup> So the disciples did as Jesus had directed them, and they prepared the Passover meal. -*Matthew 26:17-19* 

We have been walking through **The Final Week** of Jesus' life throughout Lent. Last week we talked about how Judas decided to betray Jesus for 30 pieces of silver. On Sunday we turn to Maundy

Thursday. We are going to learn why we call it Maundy Thursday and what commandments Jesus gave us on Maundy Thursday. We're going to focus on two things: the Last Supper and the things that took place in the Garden of Gethsemane. My intention is to take you to those places and help you experience the story, to see yourself in the story, and to understand what Jesus was trying to say to us as his disciples on Maundy Thursday.

The Gospel writers are relatively silent about what Jesus did during the daytime on Thursday. He may have gone back to the Temple Mount as he had on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday and taught the people. He may have stayed in Bethany. He may have gone to the Garden of Gethsemane to pray. We don't know because the Gospels don't tell us.

When it comes to the evening of Maundy Thursday, the Gospels come alive. Matthew, Mark, and Luke tell us in great detail what happened that evening when Jesus shared the Last Supper with his disciples. They went to the Garden of Gethsemane where he prayed in agony. Judas Iscariot brought the Temple Guard there to arrest Jesus that night. He was taken to the Sanhedrin at the High Priest's House, and there they sentenced him to die. All of this happened on that Thursday night. I want to remind you to set your clocks forward one hour on Saturday for Daylight Savings Time and plan to join us in worship at 8:30 or 10:50 on Sunday as we continue our journey through **The Final Week** of Jesus' life.

I also want to invite you to make plans to participate in our Holy Week Worship Services. On **Maundy Thursday, March 24,** join us for our **Maundy Thursday Service** at **6:30 p.m.** The service will conclude with Holy Communion and the *stripping of the sanctuary* as Jesus is taken into custody by the Roman soldiers. On **Good Friday, March 25,** we will remember our Lord's passion and death on the cross in our **Tenebrae Service of Darkness** at **6:30 p.m.** I hope you will join us for these meaningful services.

Easter Sunday on March 27 will begin at 8:30 a.m. with our Early Worship Service followed by Sunday School at 9:45 a.m., a Family Breakfast at 9:45 a.m., an Easter Egg Hunt for our children at 10:15 a.m., and our Late Worship Service at 10:50 a.m. It will be a joyous day you will not want to miss.

Most people are more open to an invitation to come to church at this time of the year, and I pray that you will take advantage of this opportunity to make a Christian difference by inviting someone you know to come to our Easter Services. I am looking forward to celebrating Easter with you on March 27. Have a great week, and may the Holy Spirit work through you as your share the hope of Easter with the people in your life.




## The Final Week



  - 4. Donate Easter decorations.


Remember how hard it is to get Easter Brunch reservations? This will be a fabulous alternative!




## Nichols Thrills - The Power of a Whisper

## Henderson Settlement, Kentucky Mission Trip

They asked only one thing; that we remember the poor, which was actually what I was eager to do. —Galatians 2:10

When? Saturday, July 16 to Saturday, July 23.

Where? We will stay in the Mission Dorm at Henderson Settlement near Frakes, Kentucky and work in the Appalachian Mountains. We will also spend one night in Nashville, Tennessee at West End United Methodist Church.

Cost? The cost is \$550. A \$150 deposit is due on Wednesday, March 30, 2016 and final payment is due on Monday, June 27, 2016. Talk to Trevor about family discounts if more than one member of your family is going. We will hold some fundraisers to help with the cost of the mission. If you need financial assistance, please talk to Trevor. Don't let the lack of money keep you from going.



How will we get there? We will ask members of our church to drive or loan us their vehicles.

Who may go? Adults, college students, high school students, and junior high students may go on this trip. Families are welcome.

What will we do? We will serve together as we seek to do basic home repair projects.

What fun things will we do? We will do some sightseeing and eat a nice dinner in Nashville on our way to Kentucky, and we will eat a nice dinner in Memphis on our way home.

What Training and Preparation are required? There will be two mandatory training sessions on <u>Sunday</u>, <u>April 3</u> and <u>Sunday</u>, <u>April 17</u> at 4:00 p.m. at Nichols Hills U.M.C.

**What about fund-raisers?** We will have to raise between \$2,000 and \$3,000. We will work together to raise this money. You will be expected to help with fundraisers.

**What is our purpose?** Our purpose is to share the love of Jesus Christ in meaningful ways that make a Christian difference to the people of the Appalachian Mountains.

What is our task? Our task is to do basic home repair projects.

Why should I go on this trip? God calls us to minister to "the least of these who are members of my family." This is an opportunity for you to serve God and others and to make a Christian difference in the world and in your own life.

Why am I needed on this trip? We need a diverse group of persons. If you can love and teach children, then you are needed. If you have carpentry skills, you are needed. If you can are willing to learn how to fix things, you are needed. If you are willing to help God's people, then you are needed. If you can handle money, you are needed. If you love God and want to share God's love with others, you are needed. We will teach you what you need to know.

*How Can I sign up?* Read and sign the Mission Policy Agreement and fill out the Henderson Settlement, Kentucky Application located in the church office. Be sure to turn your money in on time.
