We had a wonderful Marathon Sunday! Thank you to all who helped make this day memorable!






Tidbits from The Learning Center

The Brew Class: Meets in the Room 131 - The Brew is beginning a new study in May. Teachers: Tim and Christie Baker. Tim (405) 209-5467 and Christie (405) 922-5154.

KIVA Class: Meets in the Parlor - Allen Evans will speak on "Guns, Guns, and More Guns-A Legal, Cultural and Political Look at the 2nd Amendment. Leaders: Buzz and Linda Rosser McDaniel.

Reveille Class: *Meets in the Library* - Do you like to see how your faith impacts your everyday life? Join us for a discussion of how the Bible speaks to the current events in our lives. Teacher: Tom Fraley.

Open Circle Class: *Meets in the Archives Room* - We are studying Acts, which chronicles the first 30 years and the "Followers of the Way of Jesus" after the death and resurrection of Jesus. Paul is converted to a "follower" on the road to Damascus by the voice of Jesus who asks Paul, "Paul, why do you persecute me." Paul, both a Roman citizen and a Jew, becomes a missionary leader who mainly works on converting gentiles to Christianity. During his ministry at Antioch, the name, "Christians" evolved from the prior name, "Followers of the Way." Our scriptures this week are Acts 11:1-18 and Acts 16:9-15. Teacher: John Marshall.

Roundtable Class: *Meets in Room 124* - Luke 17:1-10 includes this: "Watch yourselves! If your brother or sister sins, warn them to stop. If they change their hearts and live, forgive them."
