Helping Others Find Hope

³⁰ When he was at the table with them, he took bread, blessed and broke it, and gave it to them. ³¹ Then their eyes were opened, and they recognized him; and he vanished from their sight. 32 They said to each other, "Were not our hearts burning within us while he was talking to us on the road, while he was opening the scriptures to us?" 33 That same hour they got up and returned to Jerusalem; and they found the eleven and their companions gathered together. 34 They were saying, "The Lord has risen indeed, and he has appeared to Simon!" 35 Then they told what had happened on the road, and how he had been made known to them in the breaking of the bread. -Luke 24:30-35

These two disciples were astounded when Jesus vanished because they realized that everything had changed because Christ has risen. They had come face to face with the Risen Lord. They said, "Were not our hearts burning within us while he was talking to us on the road, while he was opening the scriptures to us?"

When we encounter the Risen Lord, Jesus helps us find hope and helps us to understand the scriptures and God's plan for salvation. That is why we want so badly for you to connect to God in worship, and it is why we really believe that when you connect with others in a small group you will begin to grow and understand God's Word in a way that will make your heart burn within you. This is the way Jesus helps us to grow as his disciples and find hope for a blessed future. When you experience the love of God in this way you want to share God's love with the people in your life. You share it with the people you know. You share it with your family and your friends. You share it with your neighbors and your co-workers. You share it with your classmates. You share it with anyone that you care about. I want to invite you to join us for worship on Sunday at 8:30 or 10:50 a.m. as we continue our Finding Hope sermon series by talking about Helping Others Find Hope.

This Sunday is also Confirmation Sunday. Meg Miller, Gracie Sanders, Jack Love, and Luke Butler have completed sixteen weeks of confirmation classes, and they will be joining the church. Matt Patrick and I met with each of them to talk about what they had learned in confirmation and to have one more conversation about what it means to be a member of the church. They are each so excited to make a commitment that involves praying for themselves and others, being present in worship each Sunday, growing in generosity to give a tithe, using their spiritual gifts to serve in ministry, and sharing their faith as witnesses of Jesus' love and grace. I hope you will plan be there at 10:50 to support Meg, Gracie, Jack, and Luke. We are so proud of each of them.

On April 17, our Children's Choir will sing in our 10:50 worship service. It is always a blessing to welcome our youngest generation into worship and to hear them sing their praises to God. After worship that day, our Children's Ministry Team will meet at 12:15 p.m.

Wow! The John Marshall Dinner was an awesome night and a huge success! Let's start with a few facts:

We invited 178 students and coaches and administrators from John Marshall High School and six more people from the OKC Public Schools community.

Over 100 students and about 20 staff members and other guests from John Marshall attended the dinner.

About 56 volunteers from our church served by doing everything from Kitchen Duty to Waiting Tables to serving as Table Hosts, and they served with enthusiasm!!! A very special thanks to Helen Sullivan, Tracey Saunders, Marty Smith, Becky Buchanan, Katy Maxwell, Dudley Hyde, Trevor Smith and Matt Patrick for all your hard work to make this happen.

We almost completely filled 18 tables of 8 (144 seats). We served 14 large casserole pans of pasta, as well as lots of salad, bread and desserts.

Below are a few highlights of the energy-filled evening:

We played a sports trivia game to get the tables talking.

We had a slideshow of candid shots of the kids playing their sports on the big screen when they entered and throughout dinner. The students loved seeing their pictures.

The table hosts were amazing. They really engaged the students. Alfred Walker, as usual, showed us the smartest way to extend hospitality. He greeted the students at the door and asked them to come sit at his table. They all said, "Yes, sir," and followed him to his table. Other table hosts borrowed his idea.

Each coach said a few words about the season and asked each team to Stand to be recognized. It was great to cheer for them.

Our speaker, Brent Price, was a slam dunk. We showed a five minute highlight reel of his career in the NBA. Then, he talked to the students about his Three Ps of success – Purpose, Passion, and Perseverance in whatever you do. He shared that there were a lot of players who were much more talented then he was, but he worked harder than most. His message was clear, interesting, and gave them something to use when they walked out of the door. DelaneySheffield made a trading card for Brent, and the students asked for Brent's autograph.

As our center pieces, we had a "Jesus is Calling" book holding down a large balloon. It was stamped with JMHS- NHUMC 2016. At the end, Trevor asked each table to determine whose birthday was closest to that night and that person received the book and balloon. We also told anyone that would like a copy of this daily devotional to give his or her name to the table host and we would get them one. We received 33 requests for additional "Jesus is Calling" books. Thanks to a generous donation from two members of our congregation we will give over 50 of these books to students and coaches.

I think the most important message Brent shared was that God made each of us ON purpose FOR a purpose. If just a fraction of the kids there heard that message, we were a success. Thank you for supporting, serving, and praying for this ministry.
