The Ten Commandments

On Sunday, we will continue our sermon series, *Moses: the Reluctant Prophet,* by talking about the real meaning of the Ten Commandments for our lives today and how we can demonstrate God's love to the world by obeying these commandments.

We will attempt to answer some of the questions you may have about the Ten Commandments. What are the Ten Commandments? What is so special about the Ten

Commandments? Why did God give us these Commandments, and what do they teach us?

The reason God led the Israelites through the wilderness for forty years was to teach them how to live as God's people. More specifically, during this time in the wilderness, God was teaching the people how to live in right relationships with God, with each other, and with all of creation. So, rather than thinking of the Ten Commandments as God coming down to us to lay down the law, I want you to see that the Ten Commandments are a precious gift that God gives us. The Ten Commandments are special because they summarize all of the laws and are meant to help us experience the blessings that God has for us.

The Israelites were camped at Mount Sinai for eleven months, and during this time, God gave them all of the laws that are written from Exodus 20 through the rest of Exodus, all of Leviticus, and to the tenth chapter of Numbers. The LORD gave all of these laws and teachings to the Israelites at Mount Sinai during this time.

The commands are divided into two tablets: one concerning how we relate to God, and the other concerning how we relate to our neighbors. You may remember that when Jesus was asked which commandment was the greatest of all, Jesus summed up the Ten Commandments this way in Mark 12:29-31: "The first is, 'Hear, O Israel: the Lord our God, the Lord is one; ³⁰ you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength.' ³¹ The second is this, 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no other commandment greater than these."

The Ten Commandments are still relevant to our lives today and can teach us how to grow in our relationships with God and with each other. The tablet includes the first four commandments which teach us how to love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength. The second tablet includes the last six commandments. These teach us how to love your neighbor as yourself. I hope you will join us on Sunday for worship at 8:30 or 10:50 a.m. as we grow to understand more clearly how these ancient commandments can still guide our lives today.


