## Lessons from the Farm

After this the Lord appointed seventy others and sent them on ahead of him in pairs to every town and place where he himself intended to go. <sup>2</sup>He said to them, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; therefore ask the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest. -Luke 10:1-3

Both of my grandfathers were farmers and ranchers in Alfalfa County. Grandpa and Grandma Smith lived on a farm in the country north of the Great Salt Plains Lake, and Granddad and Grandma

Cochran lived in Cherokee. When I was a boy, I loved to go and see my grandparents and help them on their farms. I would ride along on the tractor or the combine as they plowed their fields and harvested their wheat. During the wheat harvest, Grandma Cochran would make a home-cooked meal of fried chicken or chicken-fried steak, mashed potatoes, gravy, corn, iced tea, and chocolate pie, pack it in her car and take it out to the field for Granddad and his hired hands. I also loved to go with them to feed the cattle hay and cake. I learned a lot of valuable lessons on the farm.

In July we are going to focus on the illustrations from the farm that Jesus used to teach his disciples about growing spiritually. Each week we'll hear interviews with some of the farmers that will help us better understand how we can live lives that are pleasing to God. On Sunday, we will welcome Dr. Dick House back to our pulpit to share a message about how Christians deal with suffering. We will learn how God can redeem our pain and give us hope.

Then, on Sunday, July 24, we will talk about the Parable of the Sower and explore the reason why God is a foolish farmer. I hope you will invite someone you know to come with you and join us for this fun sermon series.

I want to invite you to consider an exciting opportunity to grow as a leader and to help us consider some of the ways the Holy Spirit is calling our church to grow in its ministries. The Global Leadership Summit is a two-day event that is broadcast live in HD from the campus of Willow Creek Community Church near Chicago to more than 375 locations in North America. On August 11-12, most of our church staff will be attending the Global Leadership Summit at Crossings Community Church here in Oklahoma City, and I wanted to invite you to consider attending with me so that we can be in conversation about some of the possibilities for ministry in our church and our community. Please let me know if you are interested in learning more. The speakers for this year's Summit include Bill Hybels, Melinda Gates, Alan Mulally, T.D. Jakes, Horst Schulze, Travis Bradberry, Erin Meyer, Wilfredo De Jesus, Patrick Lencioni, Chris McChesney, Danielle Strickland, Jossy Chacko, and John C. Maxwell.
