Harvest Time

³⁵Then Jesus went about all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues, and proclaiming the good news of the kingdom, and curing every disease and every sickness. ³⁶When he saw the crowds, he had compassion for them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. ³⁷Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; ³⁸ therefore ask the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest." *-Matthew 9:35-38*

Have you ever thought about the way that Jesus did ministry? In Matthew 9:35 you see Jesus doing three kinds of ministry: teaching,

preaching, and healing. Jesus did not wait for people to come to him; instead, he took the initiative to go where the people lived to minister to them. He taught them how God wanted them to live. He preached to them about the Good News of God's love, grace, forgiveness, and salvation. He also ministered to people who were sick and hurting by offering them healing.

Then, in Matthew 9:36 you begin to see what motivated Jesus to minister to people. He had compassion for them. Jesus loved people, and it grieved him to see children, youth, and adults who were struggling in life. He wanted to bless them and help them experience the love and grace of the God who had created each of them in God's very own image.

Finally, in Matthew 9:37 you see how Jesus invited his disciples to join him in ministering to people. He identified people's needs, and he empowered his disciples to go and minister to those needs. Even though Jesus was the Son of God, he knew that he needed the disciples to help his ministry grow and impact more and more people.

Jesus calls you and me to share in his ministry, and I would like to invite you to join us in serving in ministry together in one or more of the following ways.

Research has shown that there are generally three times each year when unchurched people are more likely to respond to an invitation to attend worship at a church. As I have shared with you before, those three times are Christmas Eve, Easter Sunday, and the beginning of a new school year in August. On Sunday, August 21, we will have our Bring A Friend Sunday at 8:30 and 10:50 a.m., and that evening we will have our Block Party from 5:00 to 7:00. I hope you have already been praying for a friend, a neighbor, a classmate, or a co-worker who does not have a church home, and I want to encourage you to take the initiative to invite that person to come to worship and to our Block Party with you. That Sunday we will also begin a new sermon series called *Margin*. Margin is simply the amount available beyond what is needed, and we will talk about the way that God can help us learn to live with margin and experience some of life's greatest blessings.

Nichols Thrills will start again on Wednesday, August 24 at 5:30 with a Fellowship Meal and small groups for children and adults. I will be leading an in-depth Bible Study on the Old Testament called **Disciple Fast Track.** The class is a more streamlined version of *Disciple Bible Study*, and I hope you will join me in growing in faith and fellowship. Jean Warner will be leading **Dave Ramsey's Financial Peace University**, and Don and Lynn Batson will be leading **GriefShare** which is a support group for persons who have experienced the death of a family member or close friend. Matt Patrick will be leading a study called *Half-Truths* for our **Young Adult Group** at 7:00 p.m. on Wednesdays. I hope you will join us for one of these meaningful small groups. I will see you on Sunday.

Lessons from the Farm




Children's Ministry
