What about the Weeds?

²⁴ Jesus put before them another parable: "The kingdom of heaven may be compared to someone who sowed good seed in his field; ²⁵ but while everybody was asleep, an enemy came and sowed weeds among the wheat, and then went away. ²⁶ So when the plants came up and bore grain, then the weeds appeared as well. ²⁷ And the slaves of the householder came and said to him, 'Master, did you not sow good seed in your field? Where, then, did these weeds come from?' ²⁸ He answered, 'An enemy has done this.' The slaves said to him, 'Then do you want us to go and gather them?' ²⁹ But he replied, 'No; for in gathering the weeds you would

uproot the wheat along with them. ³⁰ Let both of them grow together until the harvest; and at harvest time I will tell the reapers, Collect the weeds first and bind them in bundles to be burned, but gather the wheat into my barn." *-Matthew 13:24-30*

What do you do about the weeds? It is a question that every farmer and every gardener has to answer. What do you do about the weeds? Do you try to kill them? Do you pull them up by the roots? Or, do you leave them alone? What do you do about the weeds? As we continue our sermon series on *Lessons from the Farm* on Sunday, we are going to consider two ways we can interpret this story about the weeds and the wheat. First, we're going to talk about the way Jesus interpreted this story in *Matthew's Gospel*, and then we're going to consider another interpretation that just might help each one of us grow in our relationship with God. I hope you will join us for worship at 8:30 or 10:50 a.m. I really believe that worshiping together is one of the most important things we do each week. It matters when you are there, and we miss you when you are gone.

I'm getting excited about all of the new things God is doing in our church. In the next month we will begin several new ministries, and I want to invite you to participate in each of these new beginnings.

August 21 is our **Bring A Friend Sunday,** and I want to invite you to be praying for the people you know who do not have a church home. I hope you will step out in faith to invite those friends and family members to come to worship with you as we begin a sermon series called **Margin** in which we will take a closer look at the circumstances that cause our lives to be so busy. We will also examine some of the principles in the Bible that can help us to find a healthier rhythm for our lives.

That evening we will host a **Block Party** from 5:00 to 7:00 p.m. on the south end of the church's property. The Block Party will include hot dogs, homemade ice cream, music, games, a giant Slip-N-Slide, water games, inflatables, and fun for all ages. It is not too late to sign up to help with the Block Party, and I hope you will come and enjoy a fun evening as we make new friends and grow closer together.

Nichols Thrills will start again on Wednesday, August 24 at 5:30 with a Fellowship Meal and small groups for children and adults. I will be leading an in-depth Bible Study on the Old Testament called **Disciple Fast Track**. The class is a more streamlined version of *Disciple Bible Study*, and I hope you will join me in growing in faith and fellowship. Jean Warner will be leading **Dave Ramsey's Financial Peace University**, and Don and Lynn Batson will be leading **GriefShare** which is a support group for persons who have experienced the death of a family member or close friend. Matt Patrick will be leading a study called *Half-Truths* for our **Young Adult Group** at 7:00 p.m. on Wednesdays. I hope you will join us for one of these meaningful small groups. Lessons from the Farm

Jesus began one of his most famous parables,

"A farmer went out to plant seeds..."

He frequently used illustrations from the farm to teach his disciples about growing spiritually, the practices that help us become deeply committed Christians, and the

struggles we face in experiencing the joy of the Christian life. Beginning on July 17, we will study Jesus' *Lessons from the Farm* and other New Testament teachings regarding the spiritual life.

We'll consider the intriguing connection between manure and being a Christian. We'll consider how the relentless onslaught of weeds in a garden teaches us about the many challenges to the Christian life. We'll learn how the process of putting up hay helps us understand one of the most important ingredients to spiritual maturity. And we'll look at how harvest time teaches us about the life that pleases God. Each message will include humorous stories and interviews with actual farmers to help us understand these biblical principles for growth.
