# Financial Margin

<sup>6</sup> Of course, there is great gain in godliness combined with contentment; <sup>7</sup> for we brought nothing into the world, so that we can take nothing out of it; <sup>8</sup> but if we have food and clothing, we will be content with these. <sup>9</sup> But those who want to be rich fall into temptation and are trapped by many senseless and harmful desires that plunge people into ruin and destruction. <sup>10</sup> For the love of money is a root of all kinds of evil, and in their eagerness to be rich

some have wandered away from the faith and pierced themselves with many pains. -I Timothy 6:10

In our culture today, financial stress is completely normal. You see it in almost everyone with whom you come in contact. Living paycheck to paycheck is absolutely normal. Having monthly payments is normal. Debt is normal. Worry, anxiety, and fear, especially in a slowed economy, is very normal. Sadly, having tension in your relationships and fights if you are married is very, very normal. Sadly again, having little or no financial margin is very, very normal.

The Apostle Paul tells us that those who want to be rich fall into temptation and are trapped by many senseless and harmful desires that plunge people into ruin and destruction. What are some of the many pains that we see today? We see debt causing tremendous grief. We see financial pressure causing tremendous grief. We see stress causing tremendous grief. We see financial tension over money causing tremendous grief. We see people unable to enjoy the blessings that they have because they are always worried about money.

We have ignored the virtue of contentment. Our culture's definition of happiness is more than I currently have. That is what the world is telling us. Whatever you have is not enough. If you have something else, then you will be happy. If you have just a little bit more, then you will be happy. Our culture tells us, "You deserve it! If you can't afford it, make payments! Get it now! It's going to make you happy! You've got to have it now! You are not happy because you don't have enough. Go out there and get it!"

On Sunday we will continue our sermon series on *Margin* by talking about ways we can gain *Financial Margin* which can be understood to be having more money than you need. I hope you will plan to worship with us at 8:30 or 10:50 on Sunday morning as we look to the Bible to discern God's wisdom about how we can attain the ability to be financially at rest—not anxious, not worried, and not always afraid. This is a common phrase within American Christianity and its origins date back to ancient Greece some 2500 years ago. While problematic, this phrase does have a nugget of truth in it. As Christians and as God's people, we are called to work hard and work for good in our lives and in the lives of others. Things generally don't just fall into our laps. However,

this phrase is usually used when Christians want to neglect their divine calling to help the poor and needy. Contrary to popular belief, there really are people in our world who can't pull themselves out of difficult situations because of some kind of limitation or lack of knowledge.

All throughout the Bible, God calls us to care for the immigrant, the widow, and the orphan. It is a command, not an option. It is something we *must* learn to do. I believe that it is the very nature of God to help those who can't help themselves. Let us remember that humanity was trapped by the power of sin. We can't save ourselves by pulling ourselves up by our own bootstraps. But instead of condemning us, God showed up in the most spectacular way and showed us how to live. In the end, God saved humanity through the cross of Christ, which is something we could not do ourselves. That's the power of grace. It is the undeserved favor we receive from a God who desperately loves us.


