Time to Pray

⁸ Then Amalek came and fought with Israel at Rephidim. ⁹ Moses said to Joshua, "Choose some men for us and go out, fight with Amalek.

Tomorrow I will stand on the top of the hill with the staff of God in my hand."

¹⁰ So Joshua did as Moses told him, and fought with Amalek, while Moses, Aaron, and Hur went up to the top of the hill.

¹¹ Whenever Moses held up his hand,



Israel prevailed; and whenever he lowered his hand, Amalek prevailed. ¹² But Moses' hands grew weary; so they took a stone and put it under him, and he sat on it. Aaron and Hur held up his hands, one on one side, and the other on the other side; so his hands were steady until the sun set. ¹³ And Joshua defeated Amalek and his people with the sword. *-Exodus 17:8-13*

When Jesus came to earth and saw thousands of weary, beaten-down people losing their daily battles in life he shook his head and just said to the people, "You should pray more. That's what you should do. You guys should pray more." In the Sermon on the Mount, he said, "You should ask, and you should seek. You should knock. There's no good reason why you should fend off all of the help that heaven is willing to send your way. There is no good reason why you should be trying to do all these things on human strength alone. You weren't designed to be able to do that. So, why don't you just ask once in a while for heaven's help? Why don't you seek for heaven's guidance when you need guidance? Why don't you just knock if you need God to open a door for you?"

As I look at the challenges and complexities challenging all of you these days, I think it's time for us to ratchet up our prayers. I think it's time for us to ratchet up our asking, our seeking, our knocking. On Sunday, we are beginning a five-week sermon series on prayer. If you ask me why we're raising this value up with this amount of intensity, I'll answer you by taking you back to the hilltop that Moses was standing on centuries ago as Joshua and his troops were battling an overwhelming invading army. What we are going to find is that on so many levels, the tide of your life's battles hinges on the location of your hands. I hope you will invite someone you know to come with you to worship with us at 8:30 or 10:50 on Sunday as begin our new sermon series, *Time to Pray*. I will see you on Sunday.

Half Truth: "God Said It, I Believe It, That Settles It"

This week in the Young Adult Group, the half-truth we will be discussing deals with the proper interpretation of the Bible. Many times, you will hear people say "The Bible says..." before they list off a belief or doctrinal claim. However, in most theological issues, both sides will argue that the Bible is on their side. This is because the Bible isn't simple. It isn't a straightforward document that lists off a bunch of value statements that can be taken literally. The Bible is a complex collection of 66 documents

that were all written by different people at different times in history. Because of the diversity, the Bible must be understood through the lens of the historical and cultural forces that shaped it. The Bible will always be the best revelation of God and God's character that we have, therefore it deserves more than a surface level analysis. Our culture and understanding of the world has changed over the last 3000 years, and our interpretations must take into consideration the author's context and our own.

I hope that you will join me in taking the Bible very seriously, and I hope you will join me in taking it seriously enough to dig deeper than the surface.
