Moral Margin

¹² Blessed is anyone who endures temptation. Such a one has stood the test and will receive the crown of life that the Lord has promised to those who love him. ¹³ No one, when tempted, should say, "I am being tempted by God"; for God cannot be tempted by evil and he himself tempts no one. ¹⁴ But one is tempted by one's own desire, being lured and enticed by it; ¹⁵ then, when that desire has conceived, it gives birth to sin, and that sin, when it is fully

grown, gives birth to death. -James 1:12-15

I had an ethics professor at Duke Divinity School named Stanley Hauerwas who always said that any religion that does not tell you what to do with your genitals and pots and pans cannot be interesting. That really stuck with me. We live in a culture that is obsessed with sexual things, and yet, in the church we are usually fairly reluctant to talk about this subject. As your pastor, I think it is important for us to have a conversation about this topic at least once a year. I am sure that many of the young people in our church have questions about this topic, and I believe that the church should have a voice in helping to shape the people in our church when it comes to this part of our lives.

On Sunday we will conclude our *Margin* sermon series by talking about *Moral Margin*. You may be wondering, "Well, what do you mean by moral margin?" Moral margin is putting distance between you and temptation.

Most of us know that things in our life can be done in a wise way or a foolish way. Everything in life has a wise way and a foolish way. In every area of life we would agree accept for one: human sexuality. This is one area of life that we have a hard time gaining moral margin. I want you to understand that as we talk about gaining moral margin in our lives, we are trying to help each other learn to live Godly lives that will help us to avoid some of the great pain we will experience if we veer too far off God's path for this part of our lives. Our goal is not to make you feel badly for any of the mistakes you may have made in the past. Our goal is to offer you a way that leads to life and blessings. So, we are going to examine God's wisdom about this part of our lives. I hope you will join us at 8:30 or 10:50 a.m. on Sunday for this meaningful message about how we can gain *Moral Margin*. Half Truth: God Won't Give You More Than You Can Handle

As our young adult group continues their study "Half Truths," we come across another statement that isn't always helpful. Many times, when people are going through a difficult time, you will hear the cutesy phrase, "God won't give you more than you can handle," or "God gives His toughest tests to His best warriors." These phrases can be troublesome because they are not biblically based and are actually antithetical to biblical teaching. I suppose these phrases are meant for comfort, but they don't accurately teach about God's nature.

Let's take Moses for instance. Moses was very ill-equipped to be the deliverer of the Israelites. However, because he was ill-equipped, he was open to God's empowerment. In fact, throughout the Bible, God gives many tasks to people who can't handle them on their own power.

Because those characters cannot do the work on their own, God becomes involved. Then God becomes the one who is glorified for the work, and not so much the person who was sent. The truth is, many times in our lives we will face pain and suffering, or be called to do something that is just overwhelming if we approach it alone. However, we were never called to walk the faith journey alone. One of the beauties of being called to something outside of our abilities is that it can draw us closer to God, and teach us to rely on each other for support. We are not alone and aren't called to go alone. That's good news.

Each week our program has special activities for our children. On Mondays we have a dance instructor from Tippi Toes who teaches ballet to our two-year-olds and older children. On Tuesdays we have art with Ms. Heather for the Monkeys (children who are 18 months and older) and Zebras (children who are two-years old). On Fridays art lessons are given to the Jaguars (30 months old and up) and Cheetahs

(our pre-kindergarten group.) Our hallway has a display of their work. It will be updated soon! On Wednesdays we have music with Ms. Andrea from Munchkin Music. The
