Can Anything Good Come Out of Nazareth?

⁴³ The next day Jesus decided to go to Galilee. He found Philip and said to him, "Follow me." ⁴⁴ Now Philip was from Bethsaida, the city of Andrew and Peter. ⁴⁵ Philip found Nathanael and said to him, "We have found him about whom Moses in the law and also the prophets wrote, Jesus son of Joseph from Nazareth." ⁴⁶ Nathanael said to him, "Can anything good come out of

Nazareth?" Philip said to him, "Come and see." -John 1:43-46

Do you have a friend or family member who has expr

Do you have a friend or family member who has expressed his or her doubt to you about the Christian faith? Have you ever tried to share the Good News about Jesus with that person. It can be very difficult to witness to someone you love who is skeptical. We wonder what to say. Sometimes we feel inadequate for the task. Your friend or family member asks you a tough question, and you are unsure what to say. On Sunday we are going to talk about some of the ways we can help our more skeptical friends and family members find faith in Jesus Christ.

Putting your faith in Jesus is easier for some people and harder for others. When Jesus came to Philip and said, "Follow me," he was ready to go. He was ready to say, "Here I am. Send me." He was just raring to join Jesus in his mission to make disciples.

It was harder for Nathanael. When Philip told him about Jesus, it sounded a little too good to be true. He was just not quite sure what to think about Jesus. He had questions that needed answers. "Can anything good come out of Nazareth?" Nazareth was small and poor. Only about 100 people who lived there. The Jewish historian Josephus didn't even list it as one of 45 towns in Galilee. "Can anything good come out of Nazareth?" Philip didn't debate Nathanael. He didn't scold him or belittle him. He simply said, "Come and see." That's what you say to someone who is skeptical or stuck in doubt. "Come and see." Philip wanted Nathanael to have his own experience and make up his own mind about Jesus.

Do you have any friends who have their own doubts about Jesus and Christianity? I invite you to pray for God to give you an opportunity to invite your friend to "Come and see" Jesus in our church as we continue our **Come and See** sermon series this Sunday. When you invite someone you care about to "Come and see" Jesus for themselves you give that person the space he or she needs to grow in faith.

The next Sunday on February 2, we will turn to the story of the Pharisee who came to see Jesus at night to tell Jesus, "Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher who has come from God; for no one can do these signs that you do apart from the presence of God." ³ Jesus answered him, "Very truly, I tell you, no one can see the kingdom of God without being born from above." ⁴ Nicodemus said to him, "How can anyone be born after having grown old? Can one enter a second time into the mother's womb and be born?" We'll see the way Jesus answered this religious leader's question and seek to understand why the wind blows where it will.

I also want to invite you to join us for **Sweetheart Serenades**, a music ministry fundraiser dinner, on Wednesday, February 12 at 6:30 p.m. It will be a lovely evening of great food, fellowship, and beautiful music sung by the members of our Chancel Choir.

Choir rehearsals are every Wednesday evening at 7:30 p.m., and everyone is welcome. Child care provided upon request.


