Gain All You Can

⁶ Take a lesson from the ants, you lazybones. Learn from their ways and become wise! ⁷ Though they have no prince or governor or ruler to make them work, ⁸ they labor hard all summer, gathering food for the winter. ⁹ But you, lazybones, how long will you sleep? When will you wake up? ¹⁰ A little extra sleep, a little more slumber, a little folding of the hands to rest—¹¹ then poverty will pounce on you like a bandit; scarcity will attack you like an armed robber. -Proverbs 6:6-10

When you put **All You Can** into three simple practices it changes your life. You receive God's blessings, build wealth, and bless people.

In his sermon, "The Use of Money," John Wesley summarized one of his most important teachings on faith and money this way: Gain all you can, without hurting either yourself or your neighbor, in soul or body, by applying hereto with unintermitted diligence, and with all the understanding which God has given you;—save all you can, by cutting off every expense which serves only to indulge foolish desire; to gratify either the desire of the flesh, the desire of the eye, or the pride of life; waste nothing, living or dying, on sin or folly, whether for yourself or your children;—and then, give all you can, or, in other words, give all you have to God.

Learning to handle money God's way is essential for Jesus's disciples. John Wesley practiced what he preached. In his sermon, "The Danger of Riches," Wesley spoke of his own experience of gaining, saving, and giving all he could: I gain all I can (namely, by writing) without hurting either my soul or body. I save all I can, not willingly wasting anything, not a sheet of paper, not a cup of water. I do not lay out anything, not a shilling, unless as a sacrifice to god. Yet by giving all I can, I am effectually secured from "laying up treasures upon earth." Yea, and I am secured from either desiring or endeavouring it, as long as I give all I can. And that I do this, I call all that know me, both friends and foes, to testify."

Throughout this series, members of our church—Bill Shdeed, Ann Garrett, William Stafford, and Lew McGinnis—will share how they have been blessed by these three simple practices. I invite you to worship with us in person or online as we begin a new sermon series called **All You Can** and learn to Gain All You Can, Save All You Can, and Give All You Can.

it making any real difference.


James faced exactly the same problem in the very first generation. So it's not surprising that translating belief into action —making sure faith is the real thing—is near the heart of his message.

Consecration Sunday Is Coming

At Nichols Hills United Methodist Church we approach financial stewardship from a biblical perspective. We do not view the money people give to our church merely as a way to pay the bills. Rather, we believe that how we handle money is a spiritual issue and that it is important to talk about how the wisdom we find in the Bible teaches us to use our money in a way that is pleasing to God. We find that one of the best ways to help people grow spiritually in their relationship with God is by helping them to grow in generosity by supporting our church's mission and ministry with a percentage of their income. Beginning on Sunday, October 24, our senior pastor, Dr. Trevor Smith, will preach a sermon series called *All You Can* that will focus on Biblical concepts of *Gaining All You Can*, *Saving All You Can*, and *Giving All You Can* in ways that will bless you and honor God.

Throughout these four Sundays we will focus on our relationship with God and how God's generosity to us calls us to respond by living a life of generosity. We'll let the Bible speak to us about the role of money and resources in our lives and talk about the blessings of living a generous life. We will turn to the teachings of Jesus to help you more clearly understand what it means to gain all you can, save all you can, and give all you can. You will have the opportunity to prayerfully consider, "What percentage of my income is God calling me to give?"

Consecration Sunday will be on November 14. During our morning worship services at 8:30 and 10:50 on Consecration Sunday, we will ask the people in our church to make their financial commitments to our church's missional, benevolent, and spiritual growth ministries in our community and around the world. Every person who completes an *Estimate of Giving Card* will do so voluntarily by attending morning worship on Consecration Sunday. The procedure will be done as an act of worship in such a way that no one will feel personal embarrassment if he or she chooses not to fill out a card. Regardless if you choose to complete a card, we encourage you to attend this important Sunday for our church. We will do no home solicitation to ask people to complete cards. We are delighted to have our senior pastor, Dr. Trevor Smith, serve as our Consecration Sunday preacher this year. During morning worship, Trevor will conduct a brief period of instruction and inspiration in which we will each make our commitments as a confidential act of worship. We will be sharing more information about Consecration Sunday with you in the coming weeks.

This year you will be able to participate in our **Harvest Dinner** by dining in our Fellowship Hall or picking up a take-out order. Since we will make no follow-up visits to ask people to complete their cards, we will make every effort to inform and inspire in our hope that everyone will commit to participate in Consecration Sunday through in person or online worship and our Harvest Dinner at 11:00 a.m. and noon on November 14. Thanks in advance for your enthusiastic participation in Consecration Sunday.
