# Gold for the King of Kings

In the time of King Herod, after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, wise men from the East came to Jerusalem, <sup>2</sup> asking, "Where is the child who has been born king of the Jews? For we observed his star at its rising, and have come to pay him homage." <sup>3</sup> When King Herod heard this, he was frightened, and all Jerusalem with him; <sup>4</sup> and calling together all the chief priests and scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Messiah was to be born. <sup>5</sup> They told him, "In Bethlehem of Judea; for so it has been written by the prophet: <sup>6</sup> 'And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for from you shall come

a ruler who is to shepherd my people Israel." -Matthew 2:1-6

During Advent we are taking a closer look at what the Wise Men's gifts tell us about who Jesus is and how he intends to save us from our sins. On Sunday we will talk about the way the gift of gold points to Jesus being the King of Kings. When the Wise Men came to Jerusalem seeking the child who had been born king of the Jews, it threatened King Herod and the powerful elites. Jesus would be a different kind of King, one who would shepherd the people and rule with justice and righteousness. I hope you will invite someone you know to worship with us in person or online at 8:30 or 10:50 as we continue *The First Christmas Gifts* sermon series.

Many people in our church have asked me about the meaning of the symbols on our Chrismon tree in the sanctuary. The word *Chrismon* is a combination of *Christ* and *monogram*. Chrismons are traditionally white and gold. White symbolizes that Jesus was pure and perfect. Gold symbolizes His Majesty and Glory.

**The Fish** is one of the oldest Christian symbols. The letters, from the Greek word for fish (ichthus), stand for Jesus (I), Christ (X), God (Q), Son (Y), Savior (S).

**Alpha and Omega** are the first and the last letters of the Greek alphabet. Used together, they symbolise that Jesus is the beginning and end of all things.

**The Chi-Rho** looks like a 'P' with an 'X' on top of it. These are the first two letters of the Greek word 'Christos' which means Christ.

**A Five Pointed Star** represents the five wounds of Jesus on the cross.

The Star of Bethlehem symbolizes Epiphany and the visit of the Wise Men.

**The Crown** symbolizes that Jesus is King and the ruler over heaven and the earth.

The Open Bible represents the Scriptures and reminds us that Jesus is the Word.

The Dove symbolizes peace and the Holy Spirit. It is shown pointing down to represent the Holy Spirit that appeared as a Dove when Jesus was baptized.

**The Lamp** symbolizes that Jesus in the Light of the World.

The Babe in a Manger represents Jesus as a baby at Christmas.

The Lamb symbolizes Jesus, the Lamb of God who takes away our sins.

The Bell rings out the Good News that Jesus Christ is born.

The Fleur-de-lis represents the Virgin Mary and Joseph.

The Triangle with a Circle symbolizes the unity and oneness of the Trinity: the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit

If we look with eyes of faith we will see Jesus at work in our lives. Have a great week, and I will see you on Sunday.

## ✓ IRA Charitable Rollover

Congress made permanent the law that allows people age 70½ or older who own an IRA to make cash gifts directly from their IRA to charity. For many people, this is the best tax-wise way to give. An IRA rollover gift will not be included in your taxable income and will qualify for your required minimum distribution.

# Outright Gift of an Asset

If you wish to make a gift to support your church this year, but are concerned about preserving your cash resources, consider a gift of an appreciated asset. A gift of securities, business interests or real estate can provide you with significant income and capital gains tax savings, often exceeding the benefits of a cash gift.

## ✓ Donor Advised Fund (DAF)

If you are looking for an end-of-year deduction but want more time to make thoughtful giving decisions, consider a donor advised fund (DAF). The Foundation can use your tax deductible gift to establish a DAF in your name. You can make grants from your DAF now and in the future to support the work of your church or chosen ministry.

# Zero-Tax Gift and Sale

If you are planning to sell an asset like securities, real estate or a business, before you sell, consider a "zero-tax" charitable gift and sale. By making a gift of part of the asset before the sale, you can use a tax-saving charitable deduction to significantly lower or eliminate the capital gains tax on the sale.
