## The Holy Club

<sup>13</sup> Therefore prepare your minds for action; discipline yourselves; set all your hope on the grace that Jesus Christ will bring you when he is revealed. <sup>14</sup> Like obedient children, do not be conformed to the desires that you formerly had in ignorance. <sup>15</sup> Instead, as he who called you is holy, be holy yourselves in all your conduct; <sup>16</sup> for it is written, "You shall be holy, for I am holy."

-I Peter 3:13-16

In 1729, Charles Wesley was a student at Christ Church at Oxford. He asked his brother, John, for help and wrote, 'It is through your means I firmly believe, God will establish what He has begun in me, and

there is no one person I would so willingly have to be the instrument of good tome as you.... If you would direct me to the same, or a like method with your own, I would gladly follow it." So, John began meeting with Charles, William Morgan, and Bob Kirkham to encourage them in their scholarly and religious pursuits. The small group was criticized by their fellow students when they began to receive Holy Communion weekly and to visit prisoners, the poor, the widows, and the orphans in town. Their fellow students mockingly called the "The Holy Club," "The Godly Club," "Reformed Club," "Enthusiasts," "Supererogation Men," and finally, "Methodists."

The members of the groups rigorously self-examined themselves every day by asking the following 22 questions: 1. Am I consciously or unconsciously creating the impression that I am better than I really am? In other words, am I a hypocrite? 2. Am I honest in all my acts and words, or do I exaggerate? 3. Do I confidentially pass on to others what has been said to me in confidence? 4. Can I be trusted? 5. Am I a slave to dress, friends, work or habits? 6. Am I self-conscious, self-pitying, or selfjustifying? 7. Did the Bible live in me today? 8. Do I give the Bible time to speak to me every day? 9. Am I enjoying prayer? 10. When did I last speak to someone else of my faith? 11. Do I pray about the money I spend? 12. Do I get to bed on time and get up on time? 13. Do I disobey God in anything? 14. Do I insist upon doing something about which my conscience is uneasy? 15. Am I defeated in any part of my life? 16. Am I jealous, impure, critical, irritable, touchy or distrustful? 17. How do I spend my spare time? 18. Am I proud? 19. Do I thank God that I am not as other people, especially as the Pharisees who despised the publican? 20. Is there anyone whom I fear, dislike, disown, criticize, hold a resentment toward or disregard? If so, what am I doing about it? 21. Do I grumble or complain constantly? 22. Is Christ real to me?

On Sunday, we will continue our sermon series, **The Heart of a Methodist,** by talking more about the first rise of Methodism at Oxford and how it might shape our practice of spiritual disciplines. I hope you will invite someone you know to worship with us at 8:30 or 10:50.

We had a great Block Party on August 14. Thank you to each of you who helped that evening and brought homemade ice cream, cookies, brownies, Bingo prizes, and school supplies.
