Jesus and the Possessed Man

²² One day he got into a boat with his disciples, and he said to them, "Let us go across to the other side of the lake." ²⁶ Then they arrived at the country of the Gerasenes, which is opposite Galilee. 27 As he stepped out on land, a man of the city who had demons met him. For a long time, he had worn no clothes, and he did not live in a house but in the tombs. ²⁸ When he saw Jesus, he fell down before him and shouted at the top of his voice, "What have you to do with me, Jesus, Son of the Most High God? I beg you, do not torment me"— ²⁹ for Jesus had commanded the unclean spirit to come out of the man. (For many times it had seized him; he was kept under guard and bound with chains and shackles, but he

would break the bonds and be driven by the demon into the wilds.) -Luke 8:22, 26-29

One day, Jesus casually said, "Let us go across to the other side. The disciples were not happy about this, but they went. The "other side" of the lake was the region of Decapolis, the "ten cities." This was enemy territory. The people there were pagans. The Decapolis is where the seven nations of Canaan settled. It was filled with pagan temples featuring exaltations of violence or greed or sexual expression that was everything that Israel was not. Moreover, the pig, the most unclean animal in Israel, was regarded as sacred and used in worship on the other side. For Jews, the other side was the place where Satan lived. It was dark, evil, oppressive, and demonic. No one would go to the other side, especially a rabbi.

In the Old Testament, God promised to drive "the Canaanites, Hittites, Hivites, Perizzites, Girgashites, Amorites, and Jebusites" out of the Promised Land. God had taken the land of the seven nations of Canaan and given it to Israel. Decapolis was also a center of Roman power. It housed a legion of six thousand Roman soldiers. The symbol of a Roman legion was a boar's head. Jesus wants to go to the other side.

What was Jesus doing? Didn't he know that the kingdom is for our side? It's almost as if he didn't know that this is the other side. It's almost as if he thought it's his side. It's almost as if he thought every side belonged to him. It's almost as if he thought that all the peoples of the earth were now going to be blessed through himeven the seven nations of Canaan.

I hope you will invite someone you know to worship with us at 8:30 or 10:50 on Sunday as we conclude our **Iesus and You** sermon series by focusing on how Jesus healed a possessed man in a foreign land. Together, we'll hear the way Jesus leads us to cross boundaries and take Jesus' hope and healing to the other side.

I invite you to begin Lent by attending our **Ash Wednesday Service** at **6:00** p.m. on February 22. This service will include a Time of Prayer for our church. On Girl Scout Sunday, February 26, our Girl Scouts lead us in worship and will have their delicious cookies for sale. Our Lenten sermon series, The Hard Road, will focus on the way Jesus invites us to pick up our cross and follow him as he leads us on the hard road to the cross.


