²⁸ Jesus took with him Peter and John and James, and went up on the mountain to pray. ²⁹ And while he was praying, the appearance of his face changed, and his clothes became dazzling white. 30 Suddenly they saw two men, Moses and Elijah, talking to him. ³¹ They appeared in glory and were speaking of his departure, which he was about to accomplish at Jerusalem. ³² Now Peter and his companions were heavy with sleep, and when they wakened they saw his glory and the two men who stood with him. ³³ Just as they were leaving him, Peter said to Jesus, "Master, it is good for us to be here; let us make three booths, one for

you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." 34 While he was saying this, a cloud came and overshadowed them; and they were terrified as they entered the cloud. 35 Then from the cloud came a voice that said, "This is my Son, my Chosen; listen to him!" -Luke 9:28-35

When Peter saw Jesus talking with Moses and Elijah he said, "Master, it is good for us to be here; let us make three booths, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." But before he built anything, a bright cloud overshadowed them, and God said, "This is my Son, my Chosen; listen to him!" The most important thing Peter can do is simply listen to Jesus. Don't tell Jesus what you are going to do. Listen to him! Listen to what Jesus is telling you to do. When the world seems crazy, we need more than ever to pray and listen to what Jesus is saying to us.

On Sunday, we will continue our sermon series, **The Hard Road**, by talking about Jesus' transfiguration and two stories about two persons who did not at all get the point of what Jesus is about or what the reign of God means. One was a lawyer, an expert in the law of Moses, and the other was a woman named Martha. Their situations, the obstacles to their hearing, and Jesus' responses to them were quite different. Jesus told one of them to "go and do," and he told the other to "sit down and listen." I hope you will plan to worship with us on Sunday at 8:30 or 10:50.

On Wednesday, March 8 at 6:30 p.m., the members of our church will gather in our Fellowship Hall for a Church Conference to vote on whether to remain part of the United Methodist Church or to disaffiliate from the United Methodist Church. This will be a pivotal moment in the life of our church. As your pastor, I would urge you to spend time in prayer in the days leading to this vote to seek God's will for the future of Nichols Hills United Methodist Church. My prayer is that the people of this congregation would be united in seeking to know and do God's will as we step into God's future. God has blessed us in many ways in the past, and it is my hope that God will continue to bless us in the future.

I look forward to worshiping with you on Sunday.


