Journey to the Cross

²⁸ After he had said this, he went on ahead, going up to Jerusalem. ³³ As they were untying the colt, its owners asked them, "Why are you untying the colt?" ³⁴ They said, "The Lord needs it." ³⁵ Then they brought it to Jesus; and after throwing their cloaks on the colt, they set Jesus on it. ³⁶ As he rode along, people kept spreading their cloaks on the road. ³⁷ As he was now approaching the path down from the Mount of Olives, the whole multitude of the disciples began to praise God joyfully with a loud voice for all the deeds of power that they had seen, ³⁸ saying, "Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord! Peace in heaven, and glory in

the highest heaven!" -Luke 19:28, 33-38

The Hard Road to Jerusalem ended with Jesus' journey to the cross. On Palm Sunday, Jesus entered Jerusalem, riding a colt. The crowd recognized that Jesus was the long-awaited Messiah, but they were expecting him to be a military leader who would conquer and drive out the Romans from their country. But Jesus did not come riding a white horse with a sword in his hand. He is a different kind of King. In fact, he wept over Jerusalem, ⁴² saying, "If you, even you, had only recognized on this day the things that make for peace! But now they are hidden from your eyes. ⁴³ Indeed, the days will come upon you, when your enemies will set up ramparts around you and surround you and hem you in on every side. ⁴⁴ They will crush you to the ground, you and your children within you, and they will not leave within you one stone upon another; because you did not recognize the time of your visitation from God." His journey would not lead to an earthly throne but to a cross.

This Sunday we will take a closer look at Jesus' journey to the cross which began with a parade on Sunday and ended with Jesus walking the Via Della Rosa to the place called The Skull where they nailed Jesus to a cross and placed him between two criminals to die a slow and agonizing death. This is the hardest journey for us to walk with Jesus. Like the first disciples, we are tempted to run away and leave Jesus to walk this journey alone. But walk it, we must. I want to invite you to walk the journey to the cross with us during Holy Week. I hope you will worship with us on Palm Sunday at 8:30 or 10:50 a.m.

I also want to invite you to participate in our Holy Week Worship Services. Join us for our **Maundy Thursday Service on April 6** at **6:00 p.m.** The service will conclude with Holy Communion and the *stripping of the sanctuary* as Jesus is taken into custody by the Roman soldiers.

We will remember our Lord's passion and death on the cross in our **Tenebrae Service of Darkness** on **Good Friday, April 7** at **6:00 p.m.**

Easter Sunday, April 9, will begin at 8:30 a.m. with our Easter Worship Service followed by our Easter Brunch and Sunday School at 9:45 a.m., an Easter Egg Hunt for our children at 10:15 a.m., and another Easter Worship Service at 10:50 a.m. It will be a joyous day you will not want to miss. Most people are more open to an invitation to worship at this time of the year, and I hope you will invite someone you know to come to worship with us this Easter. May the Holy Spirit work through you to share the hope of Easter with the people in your life.


